GRAPE TO BOTTLE WINEMAKING CAPABILITIES

We are farmers and winemakers with annual production of **1,300,000 gallons** (4,900,000 Litres) of wine per year.

We grow 28 varieties of own-vined, high elevation vinifera grapes on 2,500 acres of prime vineyard and tree fruit land in the esteemed Wahluke Slope¹ Accredited Viticulture Area tucked along the mighty Columbia River in the southeasterly corner of Washington State, USA.

1 Wahluke Slope AVA is a 80,490 acre region that has one of the driest, warmest climates in the state, allowing nearly complete control of vine vigor and ripening. The appellation was created by the Great Missoula Floods that exploded through ice dams thousands of years ago, ripping land and rocks from their paths during the final stages of the last ice age.


In addition to the WSDA certifications, our locations are Global GAP certified as well. Global GAP is an internationally recognized set of farming standards dedicated to Good Agricultural Practices. Through certification, producers demonstrate their adherence to Global GAP standards worldwide. GAP is now the world's most widely implemented farm certification system.

GLYPHOSATE RESIDUE FREE

Glyphosate Residue Free certification verifies that our wines do not contain the world's most used herbicide, widely known as Roundup. To be certified, our grapes must have no glyphosate residues down to government-recognized limits of detection, as well as lower levels than default government Maximum Residue Limits in the European Union and Japan.







ARETE VINEYARD - ESTABLISHED 1983

200 Acres, Wahluke Slope AVA

Honoring the Family Heritage, "Arete" is the Greek word meaning "All things good."

This vineyard has both North and South facing slopes ideal for the growing Gewürztraminer, Mueller Thurgau, White Riesling, Sauvignon Blanc, Chardonnay and Chenin Blanc. The South slope grows Syrah, Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, and four clones of Pinot Noir.

WALKER VINEYARD - ESTABLISHED 2016

16 Acres, Wahluke Slope AVA

Named in Honor of the Owner's Son

This small vineyard is home to Clone 33 Cavernet Sauvignon and is highly sought by local winemakers.

KENNEDY VINEYARD - ESTABLISHED 2017

30 Acres, Wahluke Slope AVA

Named in Honor of the Owner's Daughter

Kennedy Vineyard houses Clones 8 and 21 Cabernet Sauvignon, allowing for varying times of maturity.

Latitude: 46° N (similar to Bordeaux Region of France, which is 45° N)

MICHAEL VINEYARD - ESTABLISHED 2008

200 Acres, Wahluke Slope AVA

Named in Honor of the Founder and Owner

This vineyard lies at 900' elevation and slopes South to the mighty Columbia River. Conventional and Organic Cabernet Sauvignon, Carmenere, Cabernet Franc, Muscat Canelli, Cinsault, Barbera, Sangiovese, Merlot, Petit Syrah, Nebbiolo are all grown here.

Latitude: 46° N (similar to Bordeaux Region of France, which is 45° N)

ALICE VINEYARD - ESTABLISHED 2004

300 Acres, Wahluke Slope AVA

Named in Honor of the Owner's Mother

This high altitude vineyard (1000' to 1350') enjoys sloping changes and spans one mile in width. Conventional and Organic Syrah, Merlot, and Cabernet Sauvignon, as well as Mourvedre, Petit Verdot, Counoise, Malbec, and Pinot Gris.

LEE PALOMO VINEYARD - ESTABLISHED 2005

5 Acres, Wahluke Slope AVA

Named in Honor of the Owner's Ranch Dog Companion

Lee Palomo lies on the owner's former airplane runway. Narrow in width, long in flavor. Cabernet Sauvignon, Grenache, Grenache Noir, Malbec, and Tempranillo.

MICHAEL TAGGARES - OWNER

Michael Taggares founded Tagaris Winery in 1987. The winery honors the proper Greek spelling of the family name whose members descended from the Greek royal family and first began growing wine grapes in the 15th century. Tagaris winery is the modern day result of three generations of grape growers in Washington's Columbia Valley, where the climate and soil reminded Michael's grandfather of his Greek homeland.

Our brand's namesake, and clearly the man with the green thumb and golden shears, Eliseo "Lee" Silva arrived in Washington State from Mexico at the age of 14—the second youngest of 20 children. Frank Roth started winemaking right out of school at the age of 16 years old. He was a cellar rat for Harry McWatters at Sumac Ridge Estate Winery in Summerland, British Columbia, Canada and Hawthorne Mountain Vineyards in Okanogan Falls BC. He was asked to become the Cellar Master for Rob Griffin of Barnard Griffin winery in Richland, WA. USA, where he worked for 10 years before he was hired at Tagaris, where he has been crafting beautiful wines since 2005. His goal is to "become the premiere authority for making wine using as little oak as possible so the vibrant fruit flavors of the wine are predominant." He has 20 years of winemaking experience under his belt, and is considered one of the young guns of the USA winemaking scene.
